

Nomos = normative universe

Nomosphering = reciprocal constitution of cultural-material environs and 'the legal' (laws and legal processes)

Nomoscaping = active process of nomosphering in a land/sea-scape

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




- 1959: Mountain gorilla research begins
- 1979: Mountain Gorilla Project
- 1989: 1st Afromontane Forest Conference
- 1991: Int'l Gorilla Conservation Programme established
- 2004: Trilateral MoU on "The Collaborative Conservation of the Central Albertine Rift Transfrontier Protected Area Network"
- 2005: Tripartite Ministerial Declaration of Goma on the Transboundary Natural Resources Management of the Transfrontier Protected Area Network of the Greater Virunga Landscape
- 2006: MoU on Revenue Sharing \rightarrow First 10-Year Transboundary Strategic Plan
- 2008: Transboundary Core Secretariat established to begin implementation of 10-Year Plan; Mountain Gorilla Massacre → Ministerial Declaration of Rubavu
- 2009: Interministerial Board Meeting on the institutionalization of the GVTC
- 2013: Headquarters Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Rwanda and the Greater Virunga Transboundary Collaboration "GVTC"
- 2014: Memorandum of between International Conference on the Great Lakes Region (ICGLR) and the Economic Community of Great Lakes Countries (CEPGL) and Great Virunga Transboundary Collaboration (GVTC)
- 2015: Signing of Greater Virunga Transboundary Collaboration Treaty on Wildlife Conservation and Tourism Development

GVTC Treaty

- Obj.1: To promote and coordinate conservation of biodiversity and other socio-cultural values within the Greater Virunga wildlife protected area network;
- Obj. 2: To develop strategies for Transboundary management of biodiversity
- Obj.3: To promote and ensure coordinated planning, monitoring and evaluation of implementation of transboundary conservation and development projects;
- Obj.4: To promote and coordinate tourism development in GVL
- Obj. 5: To secure sustainable funding for Conservation of GVL
- Obj.6: To enhance and harmonise the generation and sharing of knowledge, experience and best practices for evidence based decision making
