2017 - 2018 GTFCA Report

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Institutional status and update

- Treaty refers to phased implementation of initiative first establishment of GLTP (core) and then broader GLTFCA
- Implementation of GLTFCA commenced when Mozambique became first GLTFCA Partner Country to include 240,000ha of privately managed Greater Libombos Conservancy as part of GLTFCA
- Process has been initiated to establish Muange Private Nature Reserve in Mozambique bordering Gonarezhou National Park
- Kruger National Park also in process of finalising the GLTFCA Cooperative Agreement, which ensures alignment between core (KNP) and its neighbours (Greater KNP)

Institutional status and update

- SAWC currently busy with development of SAWC Joint Training Strategy, which include development of process to identify training needs in 3 of GLTFCA nodes and development of a database of potential service providers to support these
- The GLTFCA Integrated Livelihoods Diversification Strategy was finalised and approved in 2017
- Revised KNP Management Plan developed and finalised
- LNP initiated process to update its Management Plan

Activities carried our in 2017-2018

- Further implementation of GLTFCA Institutional Reform Strategy with establishment of GLC / KNP & Pafuri-Sengwe Joint Park Management Committees
- Resuscitation of process to establish GLTFCA Secretariat
- Formalisation of GLC in Mozambique as part of implementation of GLTFCA
- Initiation of process to formalise Muange Private Nature Reserve in Mozambique border Gonarezhou National Park as part of GLTFCA Institutional Reform process
- Further development of GLTFCA Cooperative Agreement, initially focussed on alignment between KNP and the Greater KNP area
- Commencement of the Zinave National Park restocking programme
- Initiation of process to develop a landscape level GLTFCA Elephant Management Strategy
- Development of a wildlife poisoning baseline, which will guide the development of a GLTFCA Strategy to mitigate Wildlife Poisoning
- Initiated the process to develop a security plan for the Pafuri-Sengwe Node
- Revision of the GLTFCA Cross Border Operations Protocol

Activities carried our in 2017-2018

- Initiated a process to develop a GLC / LNP / KNP Joint Security Plan, which will include a sustainable resourcing plan
- Implementation of GLTFCA Improved Land & Air Access Strategy, including resuscitating the development Limpopo Tourist Access Facility between South Africa and Zimbabwe
- Planning for the implementation of the GLTFCA MTB event, which will be an annual fund raising initiative to support the community development projects in Pafuri-Sengwe Node and operationalisation of Sengwe-Tshipise Corridor
- Finalisation of process to develop GLTFCA Integrated Livelihoods Diversification Strategy

Activities carried our in 2017-2018

- Further development and implementation of the GLTFCA Youth Programme
- Initiating process to develop transboundary water management strategy for the GLTFCA
- Ongoing efforts to support GLTFCA website and FB site
- Initiating process to develop a Joint Training Strategy for the GLTFCA
- Planned implementation of first GLTFCA Knowledge Sharing, Learning & Exchange visit

Future plans

- Ongoing implementation and finalisation of initiatives highlighted in previous slides
- Other future plans include:
 - Development of GLTFCA Sustainable Financing Strategy
 - Development of GLTFCA Joint Management Strategy
 - Initiation process to support development of a GLTFCA Corridor Strategy
 - Development of a GLTFCA Joint Tourism Plan

Constraints and added value

Key constraints include the following:

- Resource constraints (financial and human resource) to support overall coordination and also implementation of projects
- Time takes long to plan and implement some of the initiatives due to the fact that people are generally very busy and have time constraints
- Added value
 - Ability of TFCA mechanism to align operational efforts to combat wildlife crimes
 - Opportunity for enhanced socio-economic development through tourism by improving land and air access
 - Diversity and level of support provided by development partners in GLTFCA
