## Institutional status and update

- The Memoranda of Understanding for Selous-Niassa TFCA and Mnazi Bay-Quirimbas TFCAs were signed in May 2015.
- There are no joint cross-border activities happening in any of the TFCAs;
- Law enforcement operations are also carried out independently in each country.

#### Future plans

- To incorporate TFCAs development program in 2019/2020 budget
- To strengthen TFCAs focal point desk
- To meet with Tanzania Wildlife Management Authority (TAWA), Tanzania Marine Parks and Reserves and Tanzania Forest Service Agency and other Conservation Agencies and strategize on strengthening TFCAs
- To organize trans boundary meetings between Tanzania and Mozambique on developing Selous Niassa and Mnazi Bay - Quirimbas TFCAs

# Constraints and added value

- > Constraints:
  - Lack of cooperation between Tanzania and neighbouring TFCAs contry;
  - Policy and legislation differences between countries;
  - Some countries that we share TFCAs are non SADC members e.g. Rwanda on Kagera TFCA.
- > Added values:
  - Sustainable movement of wild animals btw the ecosystem
  - Raised community awareness in conservation of wildlife through WMAs, JFM programs
  - Facilitated investments in Hunting and photographic tourism that benefited local communities (WMAs)

## How can the SADC TFCAs Unit help?

- Capacity building on biodiversity conservation among Natural Resources institutions such as Tanzania Wildlife Management Authority, Tanzania National Parks, Marine Parks and Reserves and Tanzania Forest Service Agency.
- Capacity building to Local Communities especially in Wildlife Management Areas.
- Capacity building to Wildlife Training Institutions.
