






Rationale for TFCA Network:

 - Component 4: Establishment of Data and Knowledge Management Systems
 - Information exchange, learning and innovation network which facilitates the gathering, processing and dissemination of TFCA related information









Purpose of SADC TFCA Network:

To overcome TFCA challenges through shared learning, knowledge management and collaboration



Key Functions of the TFCA Network

- 1. Knowledge sharing
- 2. Content discussion
- 3. Resource mobilisation
- 4. Facilitate face to face meetings







Value Added of Network for SADC TFCAs

- Finding common solutions to common challenges
- Sharing experiences
- Developing a regional repository of TFCA related information
- Enabling peer review and feedback
- Developing linkages with TFCA stakeholder groups
- Strengthening collaboration and relationships
- Conducting field visits to enhance understanding of local contexts
- Facilitating empowerment at the level of the TFCA

 - → Steering Committee to provide strategic guidance & report & advise SADC TC on Wildlife on key recommendations & network activities: one representative per SADC MS
- → General Membership: open to diverse TFCA stakeholders and practitioners, such as civil society, private sector, international cooperating partners and other government agencies






Kavango-Zambezi TFCA

The Kavango Zambezi Transfrontier Conservation Area, or KAZA TFCA, is potentially the world's largest conservation area, spanning five southern African countries; Angola, Botswana, Namibia, Zambia and Zimbabwe, centred around the Caprivi-Chobe-Victoria Falls area. The goal of the KAZA TFCA is "To sustainably manage the Kavango Zambezi ecosystem, its heritage and cultural resources based on best conservation and tourism models for the socio-economic wellbeing of the communities and other stakeholders in and around the eco-region through harmonization of policies, strategies and practices."

The KAZA TFCA process evolved from two initiatives namely, the Okavango Upper Zambezi International Tourism Initiative (OUZIT) and the "Four Corners" Transboundary Natural Resource Management initiative. However, unlike its predecessors, the KAZA TFCA initiative is owned and led by the governments of the five partner countries, with a clear focus on conservation as the primary form of land use and tourism being a by-product thereof.














- A form of cooperation
- Group of people connecting
- Guided by a common purpose
- Other forms exist (e.g. Community of Practise, Working Group, etc)

 - more loose, open & fluid with larger membership
